



"Next Generation Scripture Engagement - the South Asian Experience"

Welcome to the "Next Generation Scripture Engagement - the South Asian Experience" Bible Reading Plan! Those involved in planning the Colombo program desire that we prepare our hearts and minds for this time by spending the next 30 days interacting personally with the Word of God, in anticipation of doing it in community when we're together. As we read together God's Word, our hope is that the Holy Spirit will prepare us to be challenged and changed by the Colombo event – so we may become more like Christ through his Word.

The Bible Reading Plan focuses on what the Bible says about God's Word. God's Word is a major theme from Genesis to Revelation and will be the focus of our time together in Sri Lanka. Each morning while in Colombo we will spend an hour as a community in Bible engagement – learning about what it is and engaging with Psalm 1 around tables together. The Bible Reading Plan will help us all prepare for our time together each morning during the conference.

We would like to encourage each of you to take time to read the passages we are providing each day, and let the Holy Spirit help us to reflect on what God is saying. There is no rush. Listen to what the passage says with an open heart and mind.

When we engage with the Bible, we are engaging with God.

Come, let's meet God in his Word!

Bible Engagement Planning Team

Day One - What do we mean when we say the Bible is the Word of God?

The primary means that God speaks to his people is through the Bible. The stories, poems, prophecies and commands are the tools that he uses to meet us and form us into his people. The Scriptures are God's words given directly to us. The Bible is God speaking to us. Won't you come and listen to your Lord and Savior?

2 Tim 3:16-17

16 All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, 17 so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.



2 Peter 1:20-21

20 Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation. 21 For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

John 16:12-15

12 "I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. 13 But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. 14 He will bring glory to me by taking from what is mine and making it known to you. 15 All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will take from what is mine and make it known to you."

Day Two - How do we come to the Word of God?

As God's Word, the Bible is to be engaged in a special way. It isn't just a "happy thought for the day" or "rules to be memorized," something we read to earn God's favor, or a means to get the things we want. Scripture engagement is about meeting God. It is a relational process. When you come to Scriptures, are you meditating on them, letting them be on your heart, talking about them, letting them be planted in your life, looking at them intently, and retaining them? In short, when you read the Word of God, are you letting the Scriptures dwell in you? Talk to God about how you have been handling his Word. Below are a number of passages that teach us how we are to come to Scripture.

"Scripture engagement is interaction with the biblical text in a way that provides sufficient opportunity for the text to speak for itself by the power of the Holy Spirit, enabling readers and listeners to hear the voice of God and discover for themselves the unique claim Jesus Christ is making upon them."

Joshua 1:7-8

7 Be strong and very courageous. Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, that you may be successful wherever you go. 8 Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Day Three - How do we come to the Word of God? (continued from yesterday)

Today we are looking at a few more passages about how we are to come to the Bible. When you come to God's Word, take the time necessary to examine it, to listen and hear it, to hide it in your heart, to ponder it, to hold it firmly, to consider it and to "eat" it. As you deeply reflect on the Scriptures, God will use them in your life to help you to know him and obey him with more depth each day.

Deuteronomy 17:18-19

Day Four – What is the Word of God like?

God knows that for us to understand something we often have to relate a new idea to an old idea. The Bible describes itself using a number of metaphors. Those metaphors help us to understand Scriptures in a new way. God's Word is a seed, a light, food (have you been starving yourself of God's nourishment – spiritual anorexia?), a foundation, a fire, a hammer, a helmet and a sword.

Day Five – Qualities of God's Word

The Bible has many different qualities. For the next three days we will look at a few of them. Today we see that Jesus is the living Word of God, that the Word gives joy and light, that the Word is eternal, precious and sweet. Which of these "qualities" of God's Word makes the most impression on you? Why do you think that quality is so important to you?

Day Seven – Qualities of God's Word (continued from yesterday)

Today we continue looking at a few more of the qualities of God's Word. We will see that God's Word is true, trustworthy, perfect, unshakeable, and reliable. The qualities of God's Word are the qualities of God himself. What have you learned about God from the qualities of his Word that you've read today?

Day Eight – The Persons of the Trinity are distinguished from one another in Scripture according to their role in the divine speech

We can learn more about the mystery of God's three-in-oneness by reading the Scriptures. Some have described the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit as being One in essence, but not in function. God's Word can tell us about the different roles of the different members of the Trinity. The Father exerts his lordship through his Word (e.g., the first 2 verses), the Son is the Word spoken (e.g., the second 2 verses), and the Spirit is the powerful breath that drives the Word along to accomplish its purpose (e.g., the third 2 verses).

Day Nine – In the Bible, Scriptures are spoken of as if they were God and God is spoken of as if he were the Scriptures

There are a number of New Testament passages that cite Scripture from the Old Testament and God interchangeably. When we engage God's Word, we engage God.

Scripture Engagement is when our lives connect with Scripture and God speaks to us through it. For this to happen, we need to know ourselves, to uncover the questions our hearts and our society are asking. We also need to dwell in the narrative of God's revelation of himself in the past, using our minds as well as our senses to enter into that experience. At this intersection, we listen for the fresh ways Christ is calling to us, knowing that Christ incarnates into every culture in every age in unique ways.

Scripture engagement is a grace of the Holy Spirit—a divine-human encounter. Our part is to want it and to create conditions that favor it: quieting ourselves before God, exposing ourselves to his Word, listening.

Day Eleven – God’s Word is about Jesus

When we come to the Bible, we are coming to hear about Jesus. We are to read the Scriptures relationally, to know Christ.

Day Twelve – Where God’s Word is, there is God’s Spirit

In many places in the Bible we see that God’s Word is accompanied by the Spirit and vice versa.

“My suggestion is simple: put away study aids, commentaries, group Bible-study materials; get out a piece of paper and a pen and write down what we learn about God in a passage of Scripture. Just what we learn about the Abba. We read, we meditate, and we pray. In time these parts of spiritual reading can become indistinguishable. When they do become one, we are reading Abba-centrally. There is no substitute for reading the Bible in order to hear from God.”

Day Thirteen – Hearing God’s Word

The Bible says a lot about people “hearing” God’s Word. Most people throughout history have been oral learners; they learn mostly from hearing stories that others speak to them. Some biblical scholars say the Bible is primarily designed to be heard, not read. Look at the following verses and think about what it means to “hear” God’s Word. Are you listening to God’s Word?

Day Fourteen – Speaking God’s Word

Not only are we to hear God’s Word, we are to speak it to others. When we talk about the Bible it not only enhances our own engagement with Scriptures, it also builds up the person we share with. We talk about what we love. Do your words show that you love God’s Word?

Day Fifteen – Singing God’s Word

Much of Scripture is designed to be sung. Singing Scripture helps us to memorize and meditate on it and the music helps us to connect with God emotionally. The whole book of Psalms is the hymnal of the Bible!

“Thus you see in the same Psalm [119] how David constantly boasts that he will talk, meditate, speak, sing, hear, read, by day and night and always, about nothing except God’s Word and commandments. Day Sixteen – Memorizing God's Word

Perhaps the most powerful way to engage with God's Word is to memorize it. Memorizing the Bible means we can meditate on it all day long and that we can have it available to us when we



most need it. We can see by the way Jesus continually quoted Scripture that he had memorized great portions of it. Jesus was absolutely soaked in God's Word, and He is our model.

“I know of no other single practice in the Christian life more rewarding, practically speaking, than memorizing Scripture. . . . No other single exercise pays greater spiritual dividends! Your prayer life will be strengthened. Your witnessing will be sharper and much more effective. Your attitudes and outlook will begin to change. Your mind will become alert and observant. Day Seventeen – God's Word is clear

Day Eighteen – Increasing responsive to God's Word

It is possible to increase our responsiveness and understanding of the Word of God. We can better understand Scripture if we stand in God's counsel, grow in character, rid ourselves of evil and act humbly, by persevering through affliction and through the help of teachers and the Holy Spirit. Are you becoming increasingly responsive to God's Word? What is helping (or hindering) that process?

Bible engagement is "the process of taking in and living out God's Word for the purpose of knowing him better and experiencing him more."

Day Nineteen – God sometimes withholds his Word

There are situations where God will withhold his Word if we are not ready to receive it because of idolatry, rebellion, or by claiming we have not sinned.

Day Twenty – God's Word is wisdom

The Word thus changes our interests, our emotions, our priorities, our perspectives, our preoccupations. God wants us not only to believe him and obey him, but to be involved with him personally in a wide variety of ways."

Day Twenty-one – God's Word is our life

Day Twenty-two – God’s Word is to be obeyed

It is critical to remember that we are called to be doers of God’s Word, not just people who listen to it. To fully engage God’s Word means we must ultimately obey it.

Day Twenty-three – God values his Word

Because God’s Word is equal to God, God values his own Word.

Our problem is not a lack of intelligence or a lack of passion. Our problem is that we are lazy.”

Day Twenty-four – God entrusts us with his Word

We have an obligation to Scriptures because God has entrusted us with his Word.

Day Twenty-five – God keeps his Word

God will always fulfill what he says he will do in his Word.

Day Twenty-six – Psalm 1

For the next 5 days you will read Psalm 1. This powerful Wisdom Psalm serves as an introduction to the entire book of Psalms. It is a psalm that contrasts the wicked person with the Godly person. Psalm 1 contains powerful images of living life nourished by God's Word (described as "the law of the Lord" in verse 2).

Read the psalm for the first time to get familiar with it. Then go back and read it more slowly. Find a word or phrase that catches your eye and then slowly repeat that word to keep it in your memory. Talk to God about what the psalm means as it relates to your thoughts, needs or feelings.

What is the good news in this passage?

Remember, God is with you in his Word as you go over Psalm 1.

Day Twenty-seven – Psalm 1

Today will be your second reading of Psalm 1. Don't feel like you know everything about the Psalm because you've read it before, there is always more to God's Word as we come back to familiar passages. The point of spending time with Psalm 1 is to let it soak into your life.

After you've read the passage for the first time, take your time to read it again. Is there an image that grabs you in some way? Dwell on that image; give it your full attention. Is there something about the Psalm you want to ask God about? Be quiet and rest in God's presence.

What does this passage say about who you are?

Day Twenty-eight – Psalm 1

Today is your third day reading Psalm 1. Is it starting to become rich to you? Covering a lot of passages is one way to engage the Scriptures (like the first 25 days of this reading plan), but spending many days on one passage can be a rich source of spiritual growth too.

Read the psalm then read it again out loud. Does it make a difference when you hear the words in your ears? Read it for a third time out loud and emphasize in your reading what most connects with you. Remember that God is with you as you read. Be silent and know God.

Does this psalm help you learn anything about who God is?

Day Twenty-nine – Psalm 1

This will be your 4th day reading Psalm 1. Are you noticing that you are starting to have the psalm memorized? One of the benefits of spending longer amounts of time with one passage is that it starts to make a place in your mind.

Read the passage once, then go back and pray the passage. To pray the passage means to turn your thoughts about the passage into a conversation with God. Talk to God about what you want or are afraid of from the passage. Praise God for what he promises in the passage.



Confess to God from the passage where you fall short. Thank God for his promises in the passage.

How does this passage call us to a new way of life?

Day Thirty – Psalm 1

You have spent 30 days now looking at passages that speak about God’s Word. Has your commitment to and love for the Word deepened? Stop for a minute and praise God for his Word.



Today you will look one more time at Psalm 1. Read the passage twice, reminding yourself that you are in God's presence. Let the Holy Spirit direct you toward what God might be speaking to you. Do you notice any inclinations to action as you read this passage? What might be underneath these inclinations?

As you read in one of the earlier days of this reading plan, we are called to have God's Word on our tongue. In other words we are to speak about it to others. Who could you share some of your personal connections with Psalm 1 with today?
